

## Getting Started Bead Making Series: Fabulous Fabric Zendoodle Beads with Kristal Wick



## MATERIALS SHOPPING LIST

SILK FABRIC	ADHESIVE BACKING	ROTARY CUTTER
Plain dupioni silk in cream or white works best.	Double-tack mounting film can be used instead of glue for rolling up your beads.	Rotary cutters will save you a lot of time when cutting your fabric strips.
MAT & RULER	PRESSING SHEET	IRON & BOARD
A self-healing cutting mat and a clear quilting ruler with a lip edge are invaluable.	A Fons and Porter pressing sheet will protect your iron.	Ironing your fabric not only gets rid of wrinkles, but heat sets any designs you add.
FOAM BRUSH & WATER	WHITE ACRYLIC PAINT	PLASTIC STRAWS
A foam brush and a spray bottle of water are useful in spreading your paint evenly.	White acrylic paint or Gesso is used to prepare your fabric to receive designs.	Try different sizes and colors for variety. Black works well to hide the edges.
WATERCOLOR TOOLS	MARKERS	WATERBRUSH
Watercolor pencils like Faber Castell's are perfect for adding color to your fabric.	Tee Juice Markers and permanent black, silver or gold markers work wonders.	If you don't have a Waterbrush, a simple brush and water will work fine.
FINISHING SPRAY	CLEAR-DRY GLUE	FINISHING TOUCHES
Clear, matte acrylic finishing spray will preserve your designs – and the fabric feel.	White glue that dries clear is ideal. Weldbond works well.	For findings and tools, check your local craft store, shop online, or try Ranger, Swarovski, TierraCast, Plaid WireLace, JewelryTools, Xuron Cor
