POLISHING TO PERFECTION



Polishing Guide

for

Silver and UV Resin

Your piece is fired and you're ready for the finishing touches! Keep these pointers in mind to make your jewelry shine, whether polishing by hand or using the JoolToolTM.

For Polishing by Hand:

Polishing the Fired Ring:

- BRUSH the ring with a stainless steel brush after it has been fired.
- POLISH the outside of the ring with wet 3M sanding pads, working your way through fine, superfine, ultrafine and microfine.
- ALTERNATIVELY, you can use wet sandpaper in 600, 1200 and 2000 grits. Add a small amount of Wenol Metal Polish or other silver polish on a soft cloth and buff.
- AVOID polishing where the resin will be added.

Polishing the Cured Resin:

- START with wet 600 grit sandpaper; then work your way to 1200 and 2000 grit sandpaper, changing water between grits.
- ALTERNATIVELY, you can use 3M sanding pads to wet sand. Work your way through the fine, superfine, ultrafine and microfine levels.



For Polishing with the JoolToolTM:

Polishing the Fired Ring:

- FOR VISIBLE SCRATCHES and divots, use the purple attachment to grind them out. Otherwise, skip this step.
- ATTACH the "Magic Eraser" attachment and polish until smooth, dipping the ring in the water tray when it becomes too hot.
- SWITCH to the white polishing attachment, charged with polishing compound, until shiny.
- RINSE with baking soda and water; dry.

Polishing the Cured Resin:

- SPECIAL attachments for polishing resin, polymer clay or glass are available through JoolTool.com.
- ALTERNATIVELY, hand polish your resin following the instructions above.
