

# MATERIALS SHOPPING LIST



## ☐ NEEDLE

Size 11 beading needles work great for beading these stitches.

## ☐ PENCIL/PAPER

This is optional. Paper and pencil on hand allow you to make adjustments to designs or create your own!

## ☐ COLOR WHEEL

This is optional: Use a color wheel to help decide which colors work well together.

## ☐ THREAD

You can use a nylon base or heavier duty thread, such as FireLine, Wildfire, or Nonafil.

## ☐ WAXES/ CONDITIONERS

This is optional. These help with tension, knotting and tangling. Beeswax works great as well!

## ☐ THREAD BURNER

This is optional: Use thread burner to melt your threads for a close trim.

## ☐ BEADS

Stock up and use any you like! Think small, large, colorful and shaped.

## ☐ PLIERS

This is optional. Pliers are great for extra grip when pulling your needle through beads.

## ☐ BEAD MAT

Bead mats are great for keeping all your beads in one place.

## ☐ SCISSORS/CUTTERS

A small pair of scissors is ideal for cutting short threads. Cutters work great for monofilament threads.

## ☐ BEAD SCOOP

This is optional. This tool is a great for picking up and putting back loose beads.

## ☐ CLASP

There are many fun clasps on the market. Use one that fits the style of your project!

## ☐ BEADING AWL

This is optional. This tool helps remove knots in thread without piercing your thread.
